Overview of the Task



- 10-15 mobile-phone style videos produced by project partners
- First 2 videos available
 - <u>Demo Site in Delft</u>, The Netherlands
 - Demo Site in Camerino, Italy
- Goal
 - One video every 1 1/2 2 months
 - Achieve very high social media activity
 - Increase visibility and awareness of the project



Video Production: Content



What should the videos look like?

- 30 seconds to 2 minutes
- Filmed with a mobile phone (or another camera, but no professional setup needed)
- With spoken text, voice over, subtitles or music in the background
- Informative and entertaining
- English (if possible) or local languages (+subtitles)



Video Production: GDPR



Make sure that all people in the video have given their consent to be filmed

- Inform about videos during registration
- Check with your company's GDPR specialist
- Respect country-specific GDPR-requirements
- In public: avoid showing people's faces
- Make sure there's no copyright issues
- Place a sign at events (template in the next slide)

Photo and video recording during the event

Video Production: Content



There are no hard rules as to what you can film, as long as the video is related to MULTICLIMACT

Fairs and exhibitions:

- Record a short video of yourself or your colleagues exploring the event
- Showcase the exhibition hall, stands, and booths
- Interview an exhibitor for quick insights
- Highlight key materials like flyer stands
- Do a live recording of an interesting session



Video Production: Content



Internal workshops/meetings

- Film the room or table with team discussions in action
- Introduce the setting: "Today, we are in Bilbao for our MULTICLIMACT General Assembly, bringing together partners from all WPs to discuss project progress."

With your local team

- Capture your team in front of the project roll-up
- Show a fun clip of how you set it up or "roll it up."

Citizen engagement or collaboration events

• Visit your implementation/construction site and give a visual tour



Video Production: Software



What are some tools/software that I can use to edit a video?

- We suggest to use the app "InShot" (freely available on android and apple) for mobile devices
- For desktop use we suggest "<u>Clipchamp</u>"
- But you can use any other software that you wish as well!

7. Click "FILTER" to edit video

You can select pre-defined filters to enhance your video or edit it manually by clicking on "ADJUST"

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8. Click "TRIM" to cut video

You can cut your video if it's too long or cut several videos together by selecting a second pre-recorded video

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9. Click "MUSIC" to add sound effects



With "MUSIC", you can add music and sound effects to your video

You can change the transitions between pictures or picture and video

Once ready, click here to save your video.

The smallest quality (720p, 30fps) will be ok.

Then click "SAVE"

Video Production: Clipchamp

- 1. Getting Started with Clipchamp
- This workshop is designed to introduce participants to Clipchamp, a user-friendly online video editing tool
- By the end of the session, participants will be able to import media, edit clips, add effects, and export a polished video
- 1.1 Creating an Account
- Microsoft Clipchamp is a preinstalled video editing program from Microsoft Office
- OR: Visit <u>Clipchamp</u> and sign up with an email or Google/Microsoft account

- 1. Getting Started with Clipchamp
- 1.2 Exploring the Interface
- Dashboard: Access recent projects and create new ones
- Timeline: The area where video clips, audio, and effects are arranged
- Media Library: Store and organize imported files
- Tools Panel: Includes text, transitions, filters, and effects

- 2.1 Adding Media
- Open Clipchamp on your desktop
- Click "Import Media" upload videos, images, or audio.
- Choose between
 "Browse files" and
 "One Drive" and select
 your designated
 Videomaterial in MP4
 format

- Explore Clipchamp's stock library for free and premium content

- Rename files for easy identification.
- Create folders for better organization.

- 3.1 Cutting and Trimming
- Insert media onto the timeline by clicking on the green plus
- Or drag in onto the timeline

- 3. Basic Video Editing
- 3.1 Cutting and Trimming
- Use the cut tool (scissors icon) to split clips in the middle, if need
- For shorten clips or to cut out parts

- 3.1 Cutting and Trimming
- Drag the edges of clips to trim
- For shorten clips or to cut out parts

- 3. Basic Video Editing
- 3.2 Adding Transitions
- Click on "Transitions" in the toolbar

- 3. Basic Video Editing
- 3.2 Adding Transitions
- Drag and drop transitions between clips

- 3. Basic Video Editing
- 3.3 Adjusting Speed/Volume
- Select a clip and adjust the speed slider
- Modify audio levels for balance, if available

4. Enhancing Videos

4.1 Adding Text

- Click "Text" and choose a style
- Drag and Drop it onto the video
- Customize font, color, and animation

4. Enhancing Videos

4.2 Applying Effects

- Select a clip and browse "Effects" to enhance visuals
- Experiment with color grading and special effects.

4. Enhancing Videos

4.3 Applying Filters

- Select a clip and browse "Filters" to enhance visuals
- Experiment with color grading

4. Enhancing Videos

4.4 Inserting Music

- Add royalty-free music from Clipchamp's audio library
- Adjust volume to avoid overpowering narration

- 5. Exporting and Sharing
- 5.1 Exporting the Video
- Choose your video format
- 16:9 for desktop videos (horizontal Youtube tyle videos)
- 9:16 for vertical content (Mobile Style Videos)

- 5. Exporting and Sharing
- 5.1 Exporting the Video
- Click "Export" and choose resolution (e.g., 1080p for HD)
- Wait for rendering to complete

- 5. Exporting and Sharing
- **5.1 Exporting the Video**
- Depending on the length, producing the video can take up to several minutes

- 5. Exporting and Sharing
- 5.2 Sharing Options
- Save the file on your computer
- Or: Upload directly to YouTube, Google Drive or social media

- 6. Tips for Videos
- Keep clips concise for better engagement
- Use consistent fonts and colors for a professional look
- Balance audio levels between background music and narration
- For a more consictent apearience it is not nessasary to add music
